Describe the extent and nature of enforcement authority of campus security authority personnel:

The Campus Police Department consists of about 20 personnel including dispatchers and 13 Special Local Peace Officers with authority delineated in KRS 61.360.

Police officers and dispatchers are on duty 24/7 and all officers are certified in first aid and CPR. We monitor the campus by CCTV and officers patrol the campus by car, ATV, bicycle, and foot.

The Campus Police Department works collaboratively with other campus authority personnel to provide the safest possible environment for all campus members.

Describe the working relationship of campus security authority personnel with state and local police agencies:

We maintain an excellent working relationship with local authorities. This includes the Louisville Metro Police Department, Louisville Fire Department, State Fire Marshal, and other government agencies.

Certified instructors from LMPD are used to train our employees in relevant matters.

Section 2: Description of Information Programs

Describe programs that inform students and employees about:

(a) Campus safety and security:

Southern Seminary and Boyce College have developed policies and procedures, offers educational programs and cooperates with local law enforcement agencies to enhance the safety and security of students, employees, and guests. Southern Seminary and Boyce College recognizes shared responsibility for the welfare of the community. Additional information on security and safety policies can be found in the Student Handbook, by calling Campus Police at extension # 4444, or by visiting the Southern Seminary website at www.sbts.edu/police. Campus Police also offers numerous safety programs on campus. These include fire prevention, CPR/1st Aid/AED training, new student orientation, crime prevention, fire drills and student leader training. Training is also provided as it relates to emergency messaging and notifications in the event of major crimes or other incidents.

We use the RAVE Alert emergency notification system for emergency and other notifications affecting the campus.

(b) How to report a crime:

Campus members are encouraged to report criminal activity to Campus Police by calling our dispatch center. Additionally, campus members may call the local police department or may dial 911 to reach emergency personnel.

Campus members receive this information at dorm meetings, new student orientation, and via our website.

(c) How to prevent crimes:

Crime Prevention information is made available at the beginning of each semester during student orientation. Our website is also a good source of information related to crime prevention and other security related matters.

Section 3: Statements of Policies and Procedures

(a) Provide the institution's policy statement on making Special Reports to the campus community of crimes that present a safety or security threat to students or employees. KRS 164.9481(d)

It is the policy of Southern Seminary and Boyce College to issue a timely notice to the campus community of any crime reported to Campus Police or to the local police department, and which we are

made aware of, that presents a safety or security threat. Notification methods include RAVE Alert, email, bulletin postings, and verbal notifications.

(b) If the institution provides student housing facilities, describe the institution’s procedure for disclosing the existence or nonexistence of automatic fire suppression systems in on-campus housing facilities. KRS 164.9492

When a prospective student applies for housing, a written notice is given to that student (and/or spouse) that indicates if the building they intend to occupy has a sprinkler system or not. That person signs such document to indicate their knowledge of the existence of a sprinkler system or lack thereof.

(c) If the institution provides student housing facilities, provide the institution’s policy for giving students with disabilities priority for first-floor housing. KRS 164.9495 (1)

Southern Seminary and Boyce College will give priority to students with disabilities when assigning first floor housing.

Housing will notify Campus Police and the Seminary Clinic of the on-campus address of students with disabilities.
