SW301A EVANGELISM SKILLS FOR WOMEN

Description: This course will challenge you in personal evangelism, give a variety of practical helps in how to share the gospel and help you answer some of the challenging questions people have about the gospel. Some specific topics that will be covered are: giving your personal salvation testimony, how to share the Bridge Illustrations, the importance of prayer in evangelism, how to use creative ideas for the purpose of evangelism, how to share the gospel to children and how to do basic follow up of a new Christian. Accountability groups of three will be used to continue spiritual disciplines and to gain practice in presenting some of these methods discussed.
