Notes: Students take just ONE course per term unless they take both Weds. AM and Thurs. PM classes. Required courses are in bold face type. All courses are six weeks in length. Terms I-II meet consecutively from late August through mid-November. Terms III-IV meet consecutively from late January through late April. Specific dates are available on course descriptions on our webpage as well as on my.sbts.edu where students register. A one week break is scheduled in the fall (between terms) and in the spring (during Term IV).

We offer a Wednesday morning section of Discipleship I-II each fall. An elective will be offered on Wednesday morning during Term IV in the spring. The selected course will be announced at the end of the fall semester. A minimum number of students must commit to take the course for it to be offered. Students may take both the Wednesday morning class and a different Thursday night class simultaneously, if desired. Limited childcare will be available for AM classes as well as all PM classes.

We suggest you attempt to plan your course selection for the next three years so you will be sure to complete the required courses and be able to choose your electives accordingly. The schedule is subject to change as new courses are added but required courses will not be moved. Seminar Saturday is offered for elective credit every other March. Details will be posted on our webpage in February prior to the event.
