SW301A EVANGELISM SKILLS FOR WOMEN

Text: *How to Give Away Your Faith* by Paul Little. (IVP, 2019) ISBN 9780810848546

Description: This course will challenge you in personal evangelism, give a variety of practical helps in how to share the gospel and help you answer some of the challenging questions people have about the gospel. Some specific topics that will be covered are: the message of evangelism, how to share the Bridge Illustration, basic principles for relationship evangelism, the importance of prayer in evangelism, how to use creative ideas for the purpose of evangelism, how to share the gospel with children and other family members, and how to do basic follow up of a new Christian. Accountability groups of three will be used to continue spiritual disciplines and to gain practice in presenting some of the methods discussed.

**SW401A LEADERSHIP SKILLS FOR WOMEN
- in the Home, Church and Community**

Description: This course is designed to help the student understand what leadership looks like for women in the home, in the church and in the community. We will be identifying the character and skills that God praises in those who serve Him. We will also be personalizing the answers to the questions, "Where do I lead?" "Who do I lead?" and "How do I lead?" as we explore each woman's gifting and skills. SW401C CROSS CULTURAL MINISTRIES

Description: The course introduces the Biblical foundation for missions. Contemporary issues will be explored including: the appointment process, cross cultural communication, practical issues in the missionary life. Guest speakers related to both NAMB and IMB will be a part of this class as well. Students will be expected to complete weekly assignments and participate in class discussions. Students will complete a final project based upon the student's integration of class lectures and resources, with her own personal pilgrimage. SW401D PLAYING HYMNS

Text: *None to purchase in advance. We will provide music in class.*

Description: Have you ever wanted to learn to play the piano OR have you wished that you had kept it up as a child? This course will teach how to read notes for the right and left hand and will teach basic chord patterns so that you could play worship songs or hymns with the right hand melody and various chord patterns with the left hand. Access to a keyboard or piano is required as well as regular practice times for about 20-30 minutes five days a week.

SW401E/402 REDEEMING THE TIME

(You will also choose a second book from an approved list to be given at the first class meeting)

Description: This course will seek to explore the value of time management as it applies to ministry wives. We will first look at the Biblical basis for setting goals and priorities. Various types of organizational styles will be outlined. We will look at how issues such as perfectionism, procrastination, and the inability to say "no" hamper effective time management. Many practical issues will be discussed in detail including planners; handling paper; avoiding clutter; home management; housekeeping and kitchen organization. Assignments will involve directly applying principles discussed in class and briefly reporting on progress made. This course is aimed at challenging those who are already skilled in areas of organization and motivating those who have room for vast improvement.
