Describe the extent and nature of enforcement authority of campus security authority personnel:

The Campus Police Department consists of approximately 20 personnel including dispatchers (6-8) and Special Local Peace Officers (13-15) with authority delineated in KRS 61.360.

Police officers and dispatchers are on duty 24/7 and all officers are certified in first aid and CPR. Campus Police Department monitor the campus by CCTV and officers patrol the campus by car, ATV, bicycle, and foot.

The Campus Police Department works collaboratively with other campus departments to provide the safest possible environment for the campus community.

Describe the working relationship of campus security authority personnel with state and local police agencies (KRS 164.9485 (1)):

Campus Police maintains an excellent working relationship with the Louisville Metro Police Department (LMPD).

Certified instructors from LMPD and other law enforcement agencies are used to train Campus Police employees in relevant matters. Campus Police meets with members of the LMPD's 5th Division to share information, identify trends, and address community concerns.

Section 2: Description of Information Programs (KRS 164.9485 (2))

Describe programs that inform students and employees about:

(a) Campus safety and security procedures and practices:

Southern Seminary and Boyce College have developed policies and procedures, educational resources, as well as cooperates with local law enforcement agencies to enhance the safety and security of students, employees, and guests. Additional information on security and safety policies can be found in the Student Handbook, by calling Campus Police at 502-897-4444, or by visiting the Southern Seminary website at www.sbts.edu/police. Campus Police prioritizes the education of students and staff through several outlets. A quarterly informational bulletin is distributed to all on campus students and staff highlighting areas of safety and security as well as the current year crime statistics. The Campus Police Department works with Student Life to ensure all new students receive a safety briefing at the new student orientation. Every quarter students and staff are given information on how to find additional information on fire safety, emergency response, and crime reporting. Additionally, students and staff are encouraged to sign up for the LENSAlert, the regional emergency notification system.

The Campus Police Department uses the RAVE Alert emergency notification system for emergency and other notifications affecting the campus.

(b) How to report a crime:

Campus members are encouraged to report criminal activity to Campus Police by calling our dispatch center which is available 24/7. Additionally, campus members may call the local police department or may dial 911 to reach emergency personnel.

Campus members receive information concerning the reporting of criminal activity through dorm meetings, new student orientation, e-mail, and via the Campus Police website.

(c) How to prevent crimes:

Crime Prevention information is made available at the beginning of each semester during student orientation. The Campus Police website is also a good source of information related to crime prevention and other security related matters. Every semester the Campus Police issues an email to students providing emergency information and tips.

Section 3: Statements of Policies and Procedures

(a) Provide the institution's policy statement on making Special Reports to the campus community of crimes that present a safety or security threat to students or employees. KRS 164.9481 2(d)

It is the policy of Southern Seminary and Boyce College to issue a timely notice to the campus community of any crime reported to Campus Police or to the local police department, and which we are made aware of, that presents a safety or security threat. Notification methods include RAVE Alert, email, bulletin postings, and verbal notifications.

(b) If the institution provides student housing facilities, describe the institution's procedure for disclosing the existence or nonexistence of automatic fire suppression systems in on-campus housing facilities. KRS 164.9492

When a prospective student applies for housing, a written notice is given to that student (and/or spouse) that indicates if the building they intend to occupy has a sprinkler system or not. That person signs such document to indicate their knowledge of the existence of a sprinkler system or lack thereof.

(c) If the institution provides student housing facilities, provide the institution's policy for giving students with disabilities priority for first-floor housing. KRS 164.9495 (1)

Southern Seminary and Boyce College will give priority to students with disabilities when assigning first floor housing.

Housing will notify Campus Police and the Seminary Clinic of the on-campus address of students with disabilities.
